INTRODUCTION

The Centre for Behavioural Research in Cancer Control (CBRCC) commenced in January 2000, part-funded by the Cancer Council of WA and Curtin University of Technology.

Aim

The aim of the Centre for Behavioural Research in Cancer Control (CBRCC) is to increase understanding of the influences on people's behaviours which increase their risk of cancer, and, through this understanding, develop more effective programs to achieve individual and environmental changes that reduce cancers.

The Cancer Council WA

The Cancer Council WA (TCCWA), established in 1958, is the premier organisation in WA focusing on cancer control. In 1998 the Cancer Council of WA identified the need for the establishment of a behavioural research centre in WA to guide the development, delivery and evaluation of cancer control programs.

Curtin University of Technology

The Faculty of Health Sciences at Curtin University of Technology successfully bid to partner the Cancer Council of WA in the establishment of CBRCC.

The Faculty of Health Sciences (FHS) at Curtin is one of the most comprehensive tertiary centres of health study and training in Australia. It has over 100 academic learning programs, more than two thirds of which are for postgraduate study. These courses are offered to over 6,000 students across eight Schools and nine Centres and Institutes.

CBRCC is located at the Curtin Health Research Campus at Shenton Park. It also maintains an office on the Bentley campus in association with the WA Centre for Health Promotion Research / School of Public Health.

The Centre collaborates with the other Australian centres for behavioural research in cancer control in Victoria, NSW and Queensland and the Cancer Council in WA. It has maintained links with the School of Population Health at the University of Western Australia, the Centre for Child Health Research at Edith Cowan University, and has collaboration within Curtin University, particularly with the School of Public Health, The WA Centre for Health Promotion Research (WACHPR), The National Drug Research Institute (NDRI), The School of Psychology, the CRC in Biosecurity and the Centre for Developmental Health.

The CBRCC was invited to join with the National Drug Research Institute in a Tier One Research grouping established at Curtin in mid 2006. This recognized CBRCC staff expertise and research track record to date along with potential for future high quality research. (This is the only Tier One Research grouping in the Health Sciences at Curtin).

The National Research Centre for Asbestos Related Diseases (NRCARD) received funding for a 5-year period commencing in 2007. The Centre consists of several research groups

throughout Australia under the Directorship of Professor Bruce Robinson (University of Western Australia). CBRCC is a partner in the research group headed by Professor Bill Musk at UWA.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

CBRCC acknowledges the support of Professor Charles Watson, past -Executive Dean of Health Sciences, Professor Michael Garlepp, past-Acting Pro-Vice Chancellor, and Professor Jill Downie the Pro-Vice Chancellor, Faculty of Health Sciences, and the Cancer Council of WA, and its staff in particular Mr Terry Slevin, Ms Denise Sullivan and the CEO Ms Susan Rooney. I also acknowledge the excellent contributions of CBRCC staff, as listed in this Report.

Research program

The research program established in previous years has continued with particular emphasis on tobacco, obesity, physical activity, alcohol and nutrition.

The new asbestos research program has progressed well and new proposals are being prepared for additional projects. The Act-Belong-Commit Project was completed at the end of 2007 with very positive evaluations. Based on these excellent outcomes the funding agencies have provided resources to replicate the program in a wide range of venues throughout WA over the next couple of years. There is also potential for a national roll out of this program in worksites throughout Australia.

CBRCC staff were PI or CI on 11 new grant applications submitted to NHMRC, ARC, Healthway and other funding agencies in early 2008.

Publications and presentations

Dissemination of the outputs of research work has been a focus of this period. As well as 20 book chapters and 44 journal articles being accepted for publication, 9 others are under review and several others are in preparation. Over 28 technical reports were also prepared.

Conference papers (48) have been presented, in collaboration with members of our research teams, with acceptance of several others for presentation during the second half of 2008. These will also inform the production of refereed journal articles.

Awards

A highlight of the period were several awards received by CBRCC staff in recognition of outstanding achievement. These include: the Public Health Association of Australia (WA) Community Award for 2007 (Ray James); Curtin University Vice Chancellor's Award for Excellence 2007 (Geoffrey Jalleh); Curtin University Strategic Research Fellowship awarded for 2008-2011 (Geoffrey Jalleh). Curtin University Faculty of Health Sciences, 2007 Research Project of the Year Award (Jonine Jancey, Peter Howat, Andy Lee, et al); and Best Paper Award at the 3rd *International Symposium on Healthcare Information Management*, Taiwan, 7 March 2008 (Chad Lin and Geoffrey Jalleh). Curtin University R&D Award 2008 – Early Career Researcher with the Highest RPI points for Publications in the Faculty of Health Sciences (Chad Lin); Owen Carter was also honored by being selected as a presenter in the 'Potential leaders of the future' symposium at the PHAA State conference in 2007. Peter Howat was conferred Fellow of the Public Health Association of Australia in May 2008.

Vale

On a sad note was the retirement of Associate Professor Ray James in February and his bereavement in June after a short illness. Ray was a great team player who made a substantial contribution during his three years at CBRCC.
